


ANNUAL BLESSING OF ANIMALS

PRO-LIFE PRAYER

Good and gracious God, please grant that all who believe in your Son may proclaim the Gospel of Life with honesty and love to the people of our time. Grant us the grace to accept that Gospel as a gift ever new, the joy of celebrating it with gratitude throughout their lives and the courage to bear witness to it, resolutely, in order to build, together with all people of good will, the civilization of truth and love, to the praise and the glory of you Lord God, the Creator and lover of all life. . . . Amen. **Stewardship Reflection** Today's readings challenge the modern-day disciple to imitate more fully both the actions and attitudes of Christ. This is, after all, the point of our stewardship way of life.

Whether we are at work or school or within our own homes, our actions should be focused on others first in imitation of Christ, Who is always perfectly focused on others.

We are called to a high and holy standard – living as Christ's disciples every day and with every person the Lord places in our path. But we can move towards this goal in "baby steps." We can even take a step backward from time to time because our Father is merciful and kind. What matters is that we keep baby-stepping along, assured of the grace we need to more closely imitate the actions and attitudes of Christ. This is the beauty of the stewardship way of life.
