

The Easter Basket: . The blessing of Easter food is a festive occasion. People take special pride in preparing a decorative and tasteful basket with crisp linens (possibly embroidered for the occasion), both lining the basket and covering the food which symbolizes the covering of Christ's burial shroud. These covers are usually passed down from generation to generation. Since Roman Catholics and Orthodox Christians fast during Lent, none of the blessed food is eaten until after Mass on Easter Sunday. Generally, each member of the family eats a sample of everything in the basket While tastes vary by region and family, the basket usually contains smoked meats, sausage, butter, cheese, bread, salt and decorated/colored eggs. A white candle symbolizing Jesus, the light of the world, is placed in the basket so it can be lit during the Blessing. Another tradition is to tie two nails together in the form of a cross and place them in the basket. The foods that have a place of honor on the festive Easter table are the decorated hard boiled eggs, which are

broken and shared by all, and a lamb molded of butter or pastry representing Christ as the "Lamb of God" Butter may also be placed into a glass container with cloves in the form of a cross studding the top. Refer to the bulletin insert in last week's bulletin for more information If this is not a tradition in your family maybe this year can be the start of one. Blessing of Easter Food Baskets will take place on Holy Saturday at 9:30 am in the sanctuary.

-- Monday: The annual DIOCESAN CHRISM MASS will be held at 11AM at the Altoona Cathedral. Bishop Mark will bless the Oil of the Sick, Oil of Catechumens, and Sacred Chrism in the midst of this beautiful and moving Liturgy at which priests will also renew their vows.

--Holy Thursday: MASS OF THE LORD'S **SUPPER** will take place at 7 pm at Saint Joseph Parish... This will include a Presentation of the Newly Blessed Oils. Mass will be followed by Eucharistic Adoration until 10 pm.

Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when he established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood. The holy day falls on the Thursday before Easter and is part of Holy Week. Jesus celebrated the dinner as a Passover feast. Christ would fulfill His role as the Christian victim of the Passover for all to be saved by His final sacrifice.

Good Friday, one of the most solemn days in the Christian liturgical calendar, marks the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. On this day, Catholics around the world engage in various practices to remember Christ's sacrifice, and among these is the Veneration of the Cross.

Canon 1251: Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the conference of bishops is to be observed on *Fridays throughout the year* unless they are solemnities; abstinence and fast are to be observed on Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Canon 1252: All persons who have completed their 14th year are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their 60th year.
